

HIGHLIGHTS OF 1990

On March 21 at the Canal visitor Center in Valley View Village, model soil erosion and sediment control regulations were explained and discussed for possible adoption by Cuyahoga Valley Communities; and, an extensive report was presented by the National Park Service on current operations and projects.

On April 18 at the Fellowship Hall in Richfield Township, the draft of a document entitled, "Activities to Foster Cooperation", which covers the subject of the respective roles of local governments and the National Park Service in achieving mutually beneficial cooperation, was reviewed.

On May 17 at the Education Center of the Brecksville-Broadview Heights Schools, water quality problems in the Cuyahoga River were discussed in preparation for members and other local officials to participate in a series of public workshops being conducted in June by the Cuyahoga Remedial Action Plan Coordinating Committee.

On September 19 at the Education Center of the Brecksville-Broadview Heights Schools, regulations and administrative procedures for definition and protection of wetlands were presented and discussed.

On October 17 at the Woodridge Middle School in Peninsula Village, the Summit County Engineer, Paul Swanson, and representatives of the engineering firm of GPD Associates, presented a preliminary report of a study to determine standards and estimated costs of improvements to Riverview Road. Also, Boston Township Trustee Randy Bergdorf reported on the concerns of the community with the fiscal impact of the CVNRA.

On November 28 at the Bath Township Administrative Offices, staff members of the Cuyahoga County Planning Commission presented the concept plan which they have developed for the North Cuyahoga Valley Corridor.

ANNUAL MEETING. More than a hundred Council members, other local officials and their guests attended the Annual Meeting in February at the Taverne of Richfield. Prize-winning author Jack Gieck gave a slide presentation on the Ohio Canal entitled, "The Ditch that Brought the World to the Wilderness".
