

## HIGHLIGHTS OF 1991

On February 22 Nearly a hundred Council members, other local officials, and their guests attended the Annual Meeting in February at The Taverne of Richfield. Plans underway for the Ohio and Erie Canal Corridor, including its possible designation as a National Heritage Corridor, were presented by Project Coordinator Paul Labovitz.

On March 20 at the Canal Visitor Center in Valley View Village, the status of preparation of a comprehensive master plan for the Cleveland Metroparks was presented.

On April 17 at the Barlow Community Center of Hudson Township, the plan for constructing an interchange with state Route 8 at Seasons Road and the land development it will generate was reviewed.

On May 15 at the Sagamore Hills Township Safety Center, a resolution was adopted calling for a cooperative effort of the Council and the National Park Service to gain authority and funding for NPS participation in the costs of road improvements in the national recreation area.

On September 18 at the Sleepy Hollow Golfcourse Clubhouse in Brecksville, it was reported that action was pending in the Congress to provide NPS with authority and funding to participate in road improvement projects, and a joint report of the CVNRA Superintendent and the Council's Executive Director on procedures for such participation was presented and reviewed.

On November 20 at the Woodridge Middle School in Peninsula Village, the Director-Secretary of Metroparks, Serving Summit County reported on the district's current activities and plans for the near future.
