

## Highlights of 1994

The 1994 Annual Meeting was held on Friday, February 18, at the Clubhouse at Sleepy Hollow Golf Course in the Brecksville Reservation of Cleveland Metroparks. Following dinner, Mary Ann Lasch, Director of Programs for Scenic America, Inc., gave a slide presentation entitled, "Scenic Byways in the Ohio & Erie Canal Corridor".

On March 9 at the Hudson Town Hall in Hudson Village Cityl the Deer Management Task Force chairman, Daniel Emmett, presented a progress report. Further, motions were passed to express Council support of designation of the Ohio & Erie Canal Corridor as a national heritage corridor and, also, a proposed Scenic Byways Program for the corridor.

On April 20 at Happy Days Visitor Center in Boston Heights Village, Stephen Coles, Chief, Division of Park Planning, presented the Cleveland Metroparks' Open Space Inventory for Cuyahoga and the surrounding six county area.

On May 23 at the Cuyahoga Valley Environmental Education Center in Boston Township, David Irvine, Director of the Resident Program, explained the program and conducted a tour of the center's facilities.

On September 21 at Brushwood Lake Shelter in the Furnace Run Metro Park in Richfield Township, the Deer Management Task Force chairman, Daniel Emmett, presented an update of the task force's progress.

On November 16 at the Canal Visitor Center in Valley View Village, a review of activities to enhance the Ohio & Erie Canal Corridor was given by representatives of the Ohio & Erie Canal Corridor Coalition, the City of Akron, Metro Parks, Serving Summit County, Cuyahoga Valley Corridor, Inc., and Cleveland Metroparks.
